## School Philosophy

Belmont Classical Academy is an independent K-12 school in the classical, Christian tradition. In partnership with parents, Belmont helps each student acquire an education of the highest quality, pursue happiness, and become an influence for good in the world.

Belmont Classical Academy is an excellent fit for academically-motivated collegebound students in Utah. Latin, a key part of the academic core, is taught in grades 212. Advanced Placement courses are offered in Latin, French, Chinese, English, and Calculus. Students are accepted into the Belmont high school program based on academic achievement and a demonstrated desire to cultivate the Belmont virtues: Caritas, Veritas, Actio (Love, Truth, Action).

## Latin \& Foreign Languages

Each Belmont graduate has a distinct advantage through their study of Latin:

- Latin is required in grades 2-12.
- Students take the National Latin Exam each year, grades 7-12.

Belmont graduates complete at least 4 years of foreign language study. They frequently take and pass the AP test in their chosen language. This focus on world languages and cultures prepares graduates to connect with others around the globe.


## Student Enrollment \& Class Size

Belmont Classical Academy comprises 33 students and 16 faculty members. The Middle School and High School (grades 612) comprises 21 students. The student/teacher ratio is $4: 1$ for the Lower School (grades JK-5) and 11:1 for the Upper School (grades 6-12). Belmont Classical Academy welcomes students of any race, sex, religion, or national or ethnic origin.

## Schedule

The Belmont Classical Academy Upper School (grades 6-12) is a full-curriculum, 4-day/week program meeting Monday through Thursday. This unique schedule teaches students to organize their time and balance homework, extra-curricular activities, and time with friends and family.
