LATIN & FOREIGN LANGUAGES

Each Belmont graduate has a distinct advantage through their study of Latin:

- Latin is required in grades 2-12.
- Students take the National Latin Exam each year, grades 7-12.

Belmont graduates complete at least 4 years of foreign language study. They frequently take and pass the AP test in their chosen language. This focus on world languages and cultures prepares graduates to connect with others around the globe.

The student/teacher ratio is 4:1 for the Lower School (grades JK-5) and 11:1 for the Upper School (grades 6-12).
